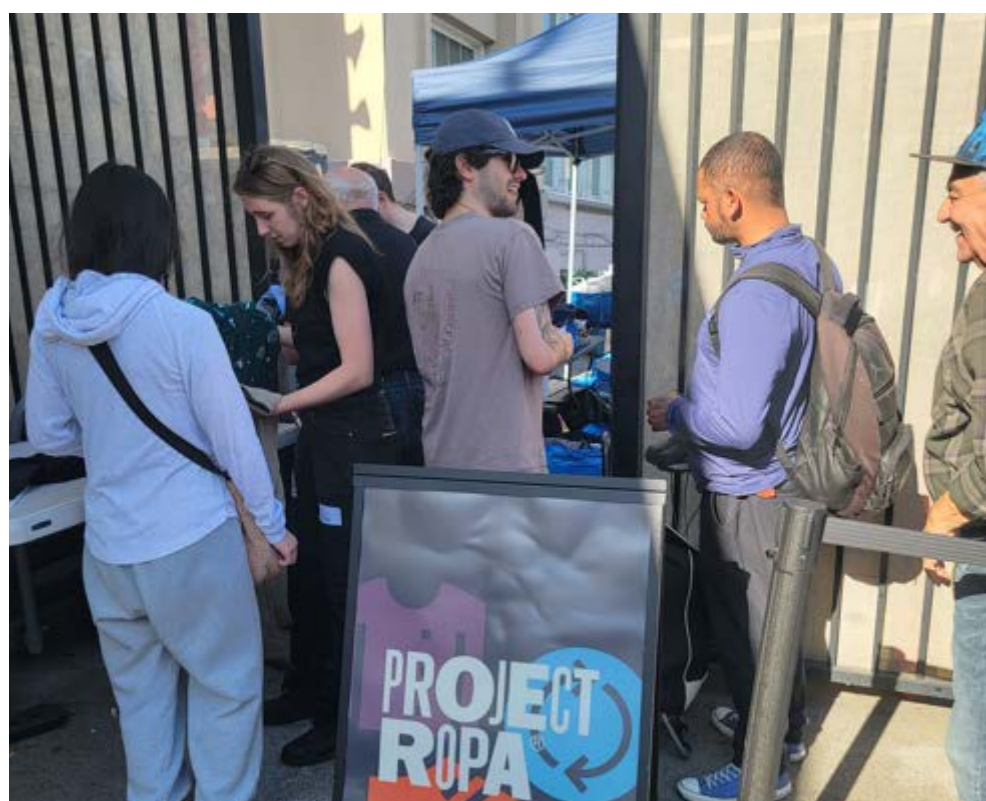

Executive Director

Dear Supporters,

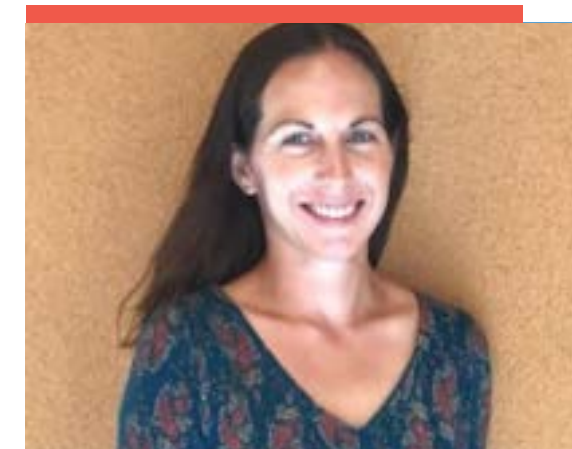
January's LA wildfires were a stark reminder of how quickly disaster can strike and how deeply it impacts our community. Thanks to the resilience and support of our volunteers, partners, and donors, Project Ropa was able to rapidly mobilize and step in to assist those affected. The generosity and dedication of our network allowed us to provide critical clothing and hygiene essentials at a moment when many families and individuals were facing immediate loss and displacement.

This year was particularly challenging, as the demand for our services from both individuals and partner organizations has increased significantly yet funding to support our programs hasn't. Federal and California funding cuts have reshaped the funding landscape, and while Project Ropa does not rely on government funding, the ripple effects of these gaps have influenced our opportunities for support. With SNAP benefit reductions forcing many to make difficult choices between food, shelter, and basic essentials like clothing, hygiene products, and shoes, the importance of our mission has never been clearer. These basic necessities are often the first barrier that prevents someone from moving out of homelessness, unlocking access to employment and housing opportunities.

As we approach our tenth year, we are excited to announce the addition of Paul Asplund-Dirani as Co-Executive Director. Paul brings over a decade of experience in homeless services as well as lived experience, and he will help share the leadership workload as Project Ropa continues to grow and expand its impact. Together, we are more equipped than ever to confront the challenges ahead and continue advocating for the recognition of clothing as an essential human need.

The mission of Project Ropa is to reduce textile waste, restore dignity, and empower the lives of those in need by providing clothing and hygiene essentials, while also advocating for clothing to be recognized as an essential human need.

The vision of Project Ropa is a city where everyone has access to clean clothes, hygiene essentials, community and support.



About Us

Project Ropa is a Los Angeles-based nonprofit and certified social enterprise dedicated to reducing textile waste, restoring dignity, and empowering lives by providing clothing and hygiene essentials to those in need. Founded in 2016 by Caitlin Adler, who began distributing essentials from her personal vehicle, Project Ropa has grown into an organization with a California Green Certified Facility and a dedicated team ensuring that vital clothing and hygiene products reach those who need them most.

Clothing insecurity affects thousands of individuals and families across Los Angeles each year. Access to clean, appropriate clothing is not a luxury—it is foundational to daily functioning and stability. Without adequate clothing, individuals face barriers to securing employment, maintaining housing, attending school, accessing healthcare, and fully participating in society. Simple necessities like interview-appropriate attire, weather-appropriate garments, or hygiene essentials can determine whether a person succeeds or struggles to move forward.

Project Ropa addresses this critical need by providing high-quality clothing and hygiene items while also reducing the environmental impact of textile waste. Our programs are grounded in dignity, sustainability, and accessibility, ensuring that every individual we serve has the resources to engage in work, housing processes, education, and community life with confidence.

What We Do

Project Ropa operates Los Angeles' only Mobile Clothing Closet for those in need. Bringing clean, well-fitting clothing, shoes, and accessories directly into communities experiencing homelessness and extreme poverty. Working alongside local service partners including providers of hot meals, ID replacement, healthcare, mobile showers, haircuts, medical and dental clinics and housing support we offer a dignified, boutique-like experience, allowing individuals to choose items that meet their needs and support daily life. Hygiene and laundry kits as well as shoes and accessories further remove barriers to stability and self-sufficiency.

Our Grab and Go Clothing Service provide weekly distributions of essential items alongside hot meals. Each grab and go pack includes clean T-shirts, underwear, socks and are provided along with shoes, seasonal accessories, and hygiene products such as menstrual products, toilet paper as well as other personal hygiene essentials. By focusing on ease of access and high-quality items, we meet immediate needs while helping guests regain confidence and dignity.

Beyond direct services, our Community Clothing and Hygiene Bank supplies local shelters, outreach programs, K-12 schools, and public service agencies with bulk clothing and hygiene products. In 2025, we transitioned the program from offering free access to all organizations to a model in which partner organizations pay annual dues. This change helps cover the operating expenses of the program, ensuring its sustainability while continuing to serve those most in need. By filling these critical gaps, Project Ropa ensures that clothing, a basic human necessity, remains accessible to individuals striving for employment, education, housing, and daily stability.

Addressing Clothing Insecurity & Reducing Textile Waste

Clothing insecurity affects thousands of individuals and families across Los Angeles each year. Access to appropriate, clean clothing is not a luxury. It is foundational to daily functioning and stability. Without adequate clothing, individuals face significant barriers to securing employment, maintaining housing, attending school, accessing healthcare, and participating fully in society. Something as basic as lacking interview-appropriate attire, weather-appropriate garments, or hygiene essentials can directly impede a person's ability to move forward.

Project Ropa addresses this critical gap by collecting and distributing quality clothing and hygiene essentials to those who need them most. By meeting this fundamental need, the organization helps remove practical obstacles that often stand between individuals and opportunities for self-sufficiency. At the same time, Project Ropa works to reduce the environmental burden of textile waste by keeping usable clothing in circulation rather than in landfills.

Our programs are grounded in dignity, sustainability, and accessibility, ensuring that every individual we serve can obtain the essentials necessary to engage in work, housing processes, education, and community life with confidence.

Together, we can end clothing insecurity in Los Angeles, but we need your help.

Our Community Clothing and Hygiene Bank provides bulk supplies of hygiene products and kits, along with new and gently used clothing, shoes, and accessories, to nonprofits across Los Angeles that serve unhoused, unsheltered, and at-risk individuals.

We know that access to clean clothing is more than a basic necessity — it is transformative. By providing high-quality, well-fitting clothing, we help individuals feel confident, supported, and ready to pursue opportunities. Clean clothing can open doors to employment, housing, education, and access to other critical resources, giving individuals the dignity and confidence they need to take the next step toward stability.
